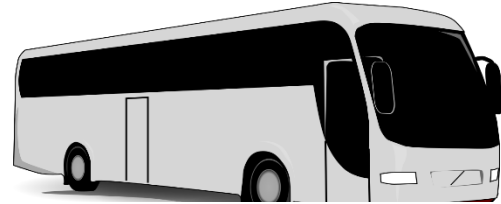


Trip to Cromford
