Could you save your milk bottle tops for charity?

All bottle tops are sent to Basingstoke Hospital, and to Chris, who then takes them to Naomi House Hospice, from there they are sold for money, so much per ton, and the money raised goes to making wheelchairs for disabled children. A wheelchair for Cerebral palsy children, which can cost thousands of pounds as they have to be especially designed and built for them, also for other wheel chairs for disabled children in the United Kingdom. The more sold and the more money raised the more wheelchairs can be provided, for those in need, which the NHS and Social Services cannot provide because of the cost each time.

This is a good service as normally milk bottle tops are thrown away, as they cannot be recycled. It's a fantastic service that Naomi House provides for the UK every year.

If you are able to do this, please bring the tops into the main meeting and there will be a box on the committee table for them. The committee are happy to pass them on.
