

Quick and Easy recipes

Cheeselettes

3 eggs

2oz SR Flour

4oz grated cheese

Grated onion

Salt and pepper

Mix all the ingredients together. Heat some oil in a frying pan and drop in spoonfuls of the mixture. Fry until crisp and golden brown and then turn over and fry the other side. Drain well and serve with bacon, baked beans or a salad.

Tuna Fish Cakes

Tin of tuna in oil

1lb mashed potato

Anchovy paste

Egg

Bread crumbs

Oil for frying.

Mix together the mashed potato, tuna, anchovy paste and add the egg to make a soft mix. Make into fish cakes and coat with breadcrumbs. Fry on both sides in hot oil.

Much tastier than shop bought ones.

Handy hint: when baking place cakes, pastry or anything hot that might stick to its tin on a very wet cloth for a minute or so before attempting to turn it out. This will loosen it slightly from the base of the tin.
